#### **EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS**

#### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;

A helicopter is being used for the purpose of lifting cattle from one area to the b7D other and then at the location where the cattle are placed, mutiliations are performed, such as removing the sex organs of the animal or the brains, or, in some cases, only bleeding of the animal with no further removal of organs. He advised that the meat has apparently not been taken for use. advised that witnesses have observed the helicopter in the area and actually transporting carcasses. The helicopter has been described as a Bell 47, b7C gun metal gray in color, with black letters on the side of the body. Investigation conducted in the United States has failed to identify a Bell 47 Helicopter, gun metal gray in color, bearing a registration prefix "NZ."

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, advised there are no United States registered helicopters with prefix digits "NZ," or suffix digits "NZ."

There have been numerous helicopters working in the Butte, Montana, area throughout the Summer and Fall of 1979 primarily on oil exploration and pipeline construction; however, review of records at the Control Tower at the Butte Airport and fuel sales receipts at Butte Aero, the only fuel distributor at this airport, failed to reveal that a helicopter bearing a registration number containing the digits "NZ" has been fueled.

Control Tower personnel and fuel truck operators have been alerted to advise this office of the future presence of any helicopter bearing the digits "NZ."
